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QUANTITY BASICS WITH BEARS!

Hi friends!

My little homeschoolers have pretty much mastered counting 1-10, so I figured it's time to start showing them all those numbers actually mean something...

Time to teach quantity!

I started with something super simple: circles drawn on construction paper (see above). We used our <u>Skoozy bear set</u>, but you could use any small objects!

I walked the twins through putting 1 bear in a circle. Then 2 bears in another circle. And so on.

For now, I'm only going to focus on quantities of up to 5. My kids have a ways to go before they master this, but that's okay!

I decided to make this activity into something nicely formatted for you. I also added addition and subtraction signs, circles of various sizes, and numbers.

If your kids already understand quantity, use the math symbols to start introducing basic math.







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
